A YEAR IN REVIEW | 2018 IN A GLANCE

NATIONAL | BEST MEDICINES COALITION

Representing the Canadian Epilepsy Alliance, CEO Dianne McKenzie sits on the Best Medicines Coalition (BMC).

The BMC is a national alliance of 24 patient organizations with a shared goal of equitable and consistent access for all Canadians to safe and effective medicines to improve patient outcomes. As an important aspect of its work, the BMC strives to ensure that Canadian patients have a voice and are meaningful participants in health policy development, specifically regarding pharmaceutical care.

Throughout 2018 BMC directors from coast to coast, focused on national pharmacare implementation, with a submission report for 'Equitable & Comprehensive Pharmacare For All' to the Advisory Council. They also invested in input regarding proposed amendments to the patented medicines regulations, ensuring the patient voice is heard regarding pricing of medication being aimed at sustaining the life, health and wellbeing of patients, medication availability, and timely access.

EDR is honoured to continue to be a part of this national coalition supporting those living with epilepsy nationwide.

PROVINCIAL | SCHOOL SAFETY LEGISLATION

Safety and the well-being of students with epilepsy in schools has always been a top priority for EDR. Working in collaboration with Epilepsy Ontario and fellow Community Epilepsy Agencies, EDR played an integral role in the development and approval of the Ontario government's 2017 policy, Supporting Children and Students with Prevalent Medical Conditions. This new policy, officially launched across the province in 2018, improves the safety of children living with prevalent medical conditions like epilepsy by requiring school boards to provide an individual plan of care, which outlines contacts and procedures tailored to meet the daily medical needs of the student. EDR has actively been a part of insisting this policy is adhered to for students in Durham Region. Please inquire with your school/school board if you have not partnered with your school administration to complete your child's plan of care.

PROVINCIAL | GOVERNMENT RELATIONS TASK FORCE

Queen's Park - Epilepsy Action Day

Community Epilepsy Agencies across the province have a unique vantage point in that we provide information and support to persons with epilepsy across the continuum of the lifespan. We understand the fear after the first seizure and the misconceptions that newly diagnosed people share. Living with epilepsy is extremely difficult, which leads to disturbing rates of depression, unemployment, and suicide. With the burden that epilepsy has on the families affected by it, the healthcare system, and the economy, EDR is working collaboratively Epilepsy South Central Ontario, Epilepsy Toronto, and Epilepsy Ontario and has developed a Government Relations Task Force. In 2018, this task force completed a pre-budget submission to the Ontario government outlining the current costs associated with emergency room visits and how costs could be reduced by investing in epilepsy educators. The submission was received favourably, reviewed and returned for clarification. We are happy to announce we have been invited to resubmit for 2019 our application. We continue with our Queen's Park Action initiatives to advocate for funding with our local MPPS and work collectively to ensure epilepsy and its provincial wide consistent care remain on the forefront for funding and budget allocation.

REGIONAL | EPILEPSY CARE IN DURHAM REGION

Community Epilepsy Agencies, like EDR, are on the front line working to support children, youth, parents, adults, and seniors living with epilepsy. As front line workers, we often see individuals and families seeking information and support during a crisis, after the loss of a job, or after the injury of death of a loved one. Our message is very clear – we need to be proactive to provide newly diagnosed individuals with epilepsy with information and support before they are in crisis. With that, in November of 2018, EDR launched its first day our local Epilepsy Clinic, which sees a local Epileptologist, with a full time EEG capacity, and EDR's Clinic to Community (C2C) Education Centre. C2C helps

the entire family to develop heath management skills and combines health information with patient education, highlighting our hallmark that EDUCATION combined with KNOWLEDGE and SUPPORT equals EMPOWERMENT.

VOLUNTEER ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

All of our accomplishments and successes are made possible by the critical work of our volunteers. Our volunteers help us to find strength in numbers, enabling our ability to provide support, education, advocacy, and empowerment to those touched by epilepsy.
