A YEAR IN REVIEW



PROVINCIAL | AGENCY COLLABORATIONS

Epilepsy Durham Region is working collaboratively with epilepsy agencies across Ontario. In 2021 we were able to launch a new client management software that enables us to better track and manage clients' needs over time. This will provide a seamless and improved experience for people living with epilepsy. The standardized approach also enables agencies to provide province-wide data to government funders regarding the needs of people living with epilepsy in Ontario.

The Task Force continues to work with federal, provincial and regional levels of government advocating for core funding in the federal budget. While our effort continues to be received favourably, funding for community epilepsy agencies has not yet been included in the government's budget. We will continue to advocate for funding to ensure province-wide consistent and appropriate epilepsy care.

REGIONAL | BUILDING BACK BETTER

In March 2020 the worldwide pandemic, COVID-19, caused Epilepsy Durham Region to close all in-person services, which reduced services to 15% capacity. After transitioning to virtual service delivery, and improving operations affecting service delivery, we returned to full capacity. By year-end 2021, the agency serviced 129% of clients compared to pre-COVID norms.

OPERATONS | STAFF TRANSITIONS

In November 2020, Darryl Swain was brought onboard as Executive Director (Interim) to advance the agency's technology transition, improve operational efficiencies, fully open virtual services and assist with strategic planning for 2021 and the future.

December 2021, Chelsea Kerstens, returned from maternity leave to resume her role as the new Executive Director of Epilepsy Durham Region. Chelsea is currently developing a roadmap for the future for Epilepsy Durham Region.

Chelsea's client centered approach ensures people living with epilepsy will continue to receive quality service and support. Her first priority will be to fill the Client Services Coordinator vacancy that was created after her promotion.

COVID-19 restrictions affected all of our in-person activities for all of 2021, which prevented our volunteers from engaging with us and the community.
